



General Description

This N-Channel MOSFET has been designed specifically to improve the overall efficiency of DC/DC converters using either synchronous or conventional switching PWM controllers. It has been optimized for low gate charge, low $r_{DS(on)}$ and fast switching speed.






Figure 1. On Region Characteristics




Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 3. Normalized On Resistance vs Junction Temperature




Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage




Figure 9. Unclamped Inductive Switching Capability




Figure 10. Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs Case Temperature




Figure 11. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 12. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation




Figure 13. Junction-to-Case Transient Thermal Response Curve




Figure 14. Junction-to-Ambient Transient Thermal Response Curve



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
