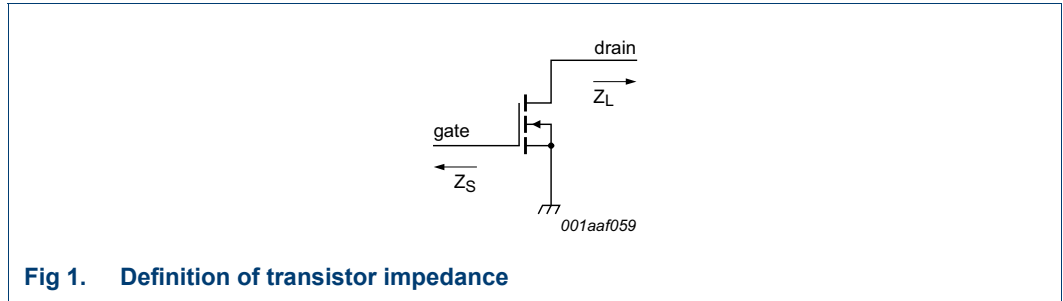

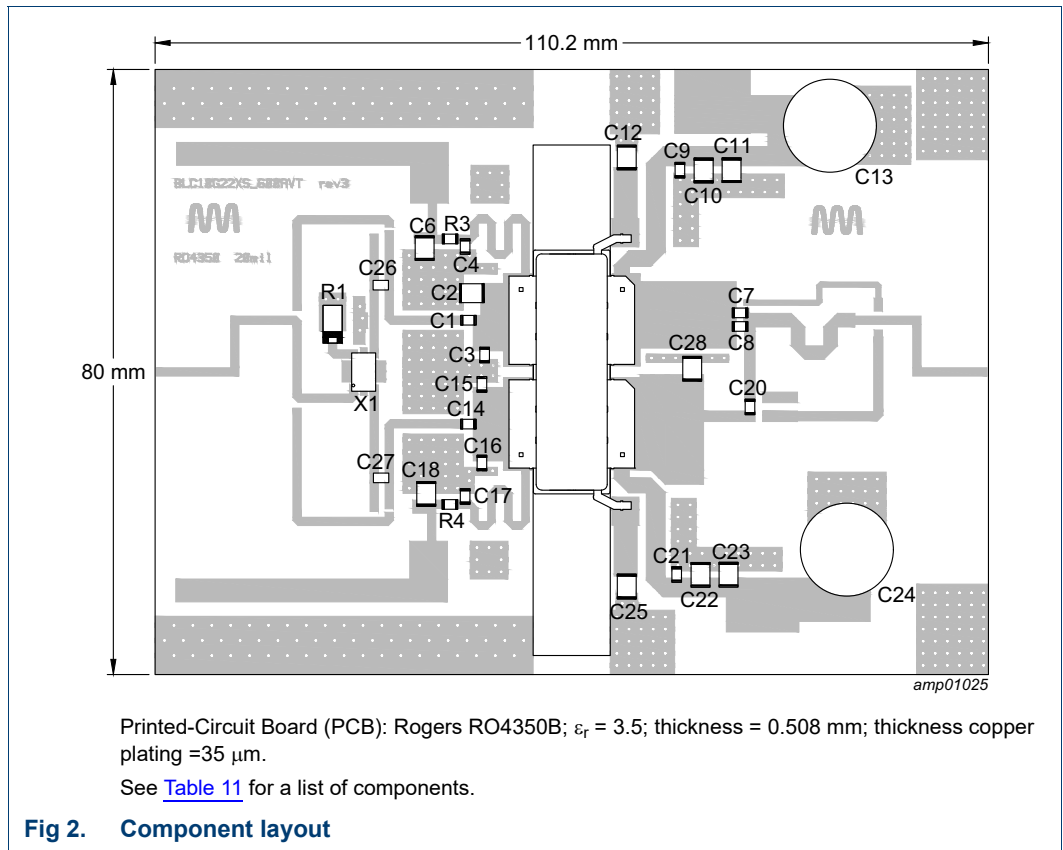

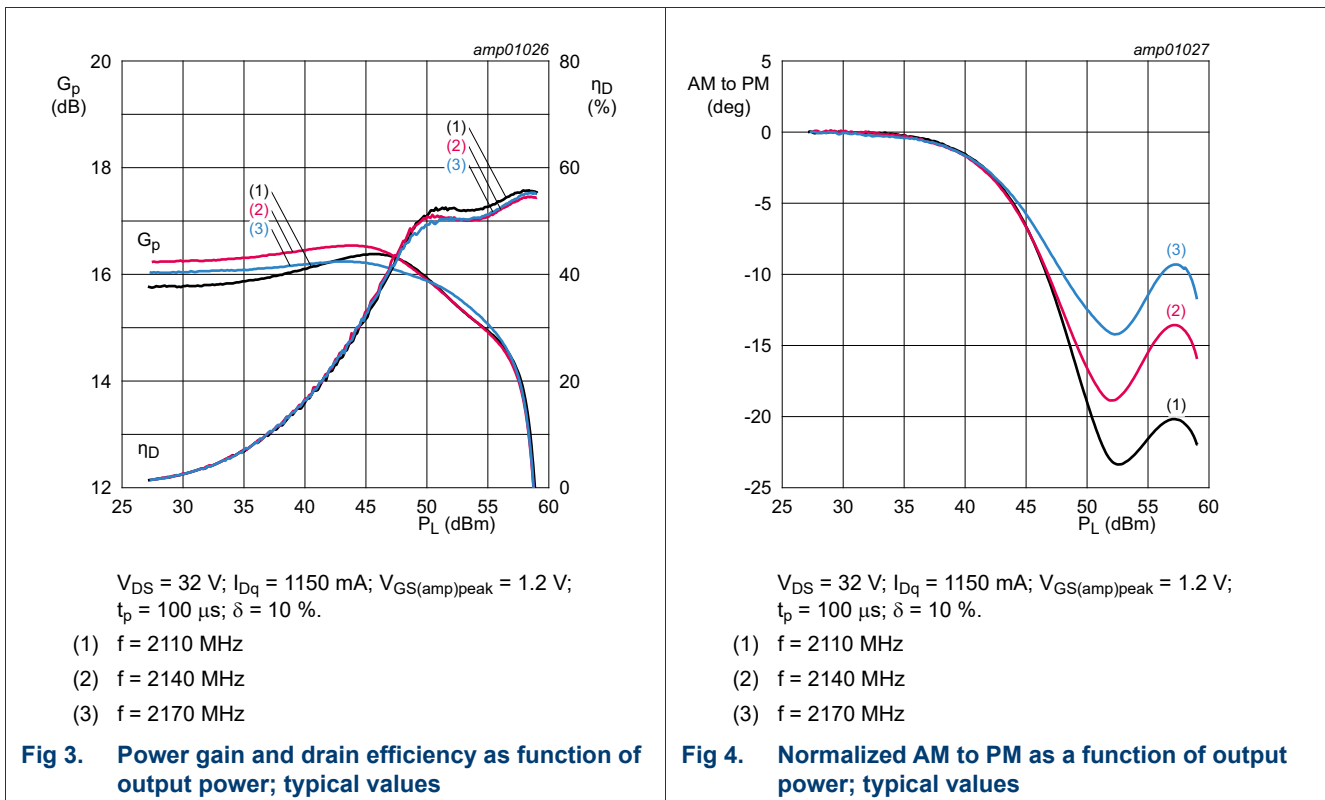

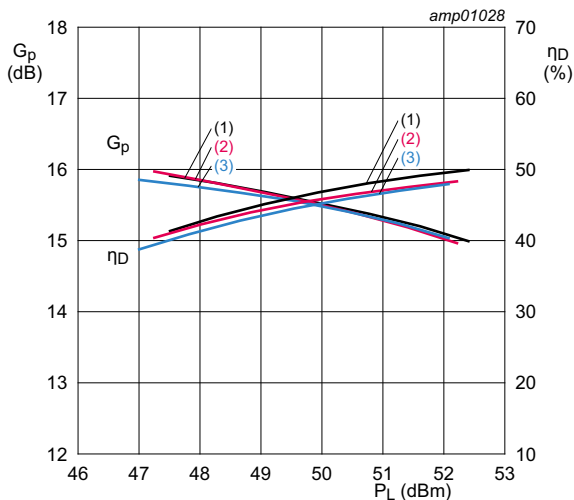

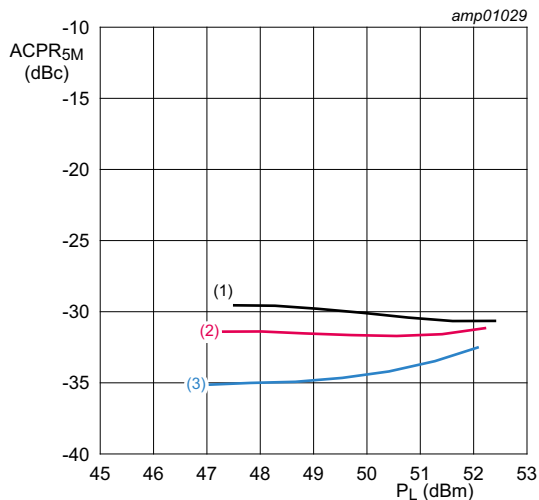

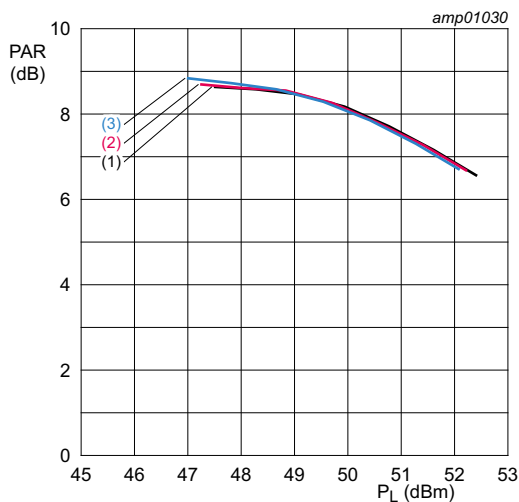

Fig 6. Adjacent channel power ratio (5 MHz) as a function of output power; typical values

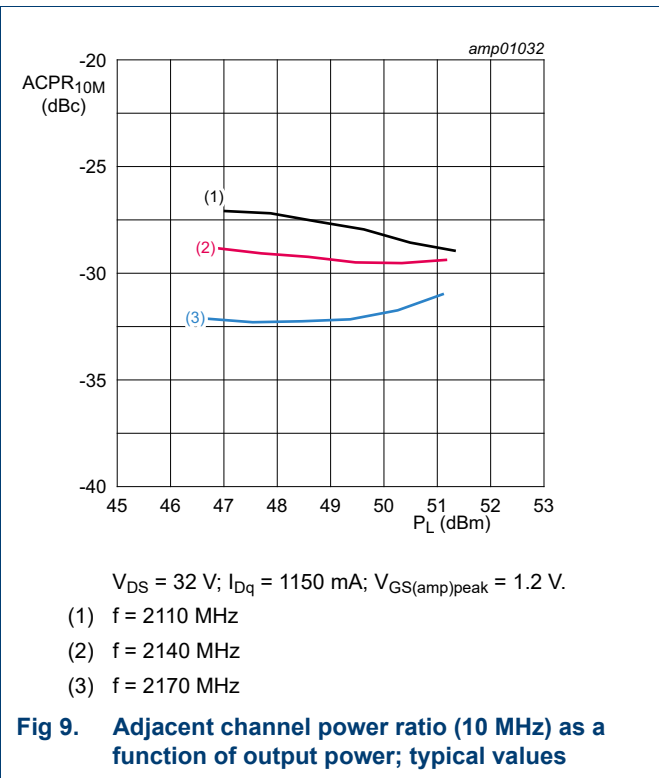
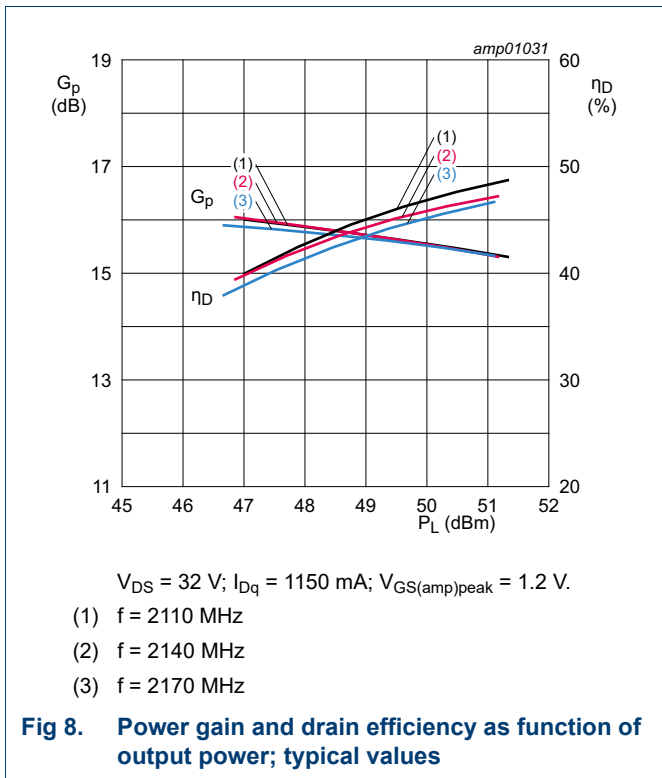

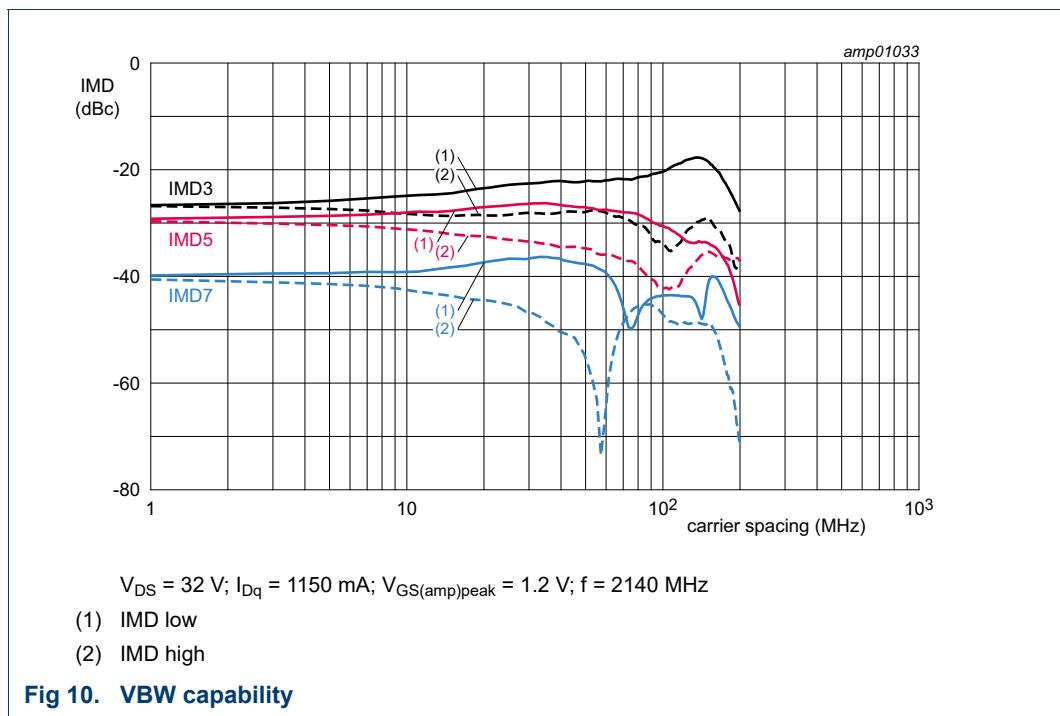
Fig 7. Peak-to-average power ratio as a function of output power; typical values

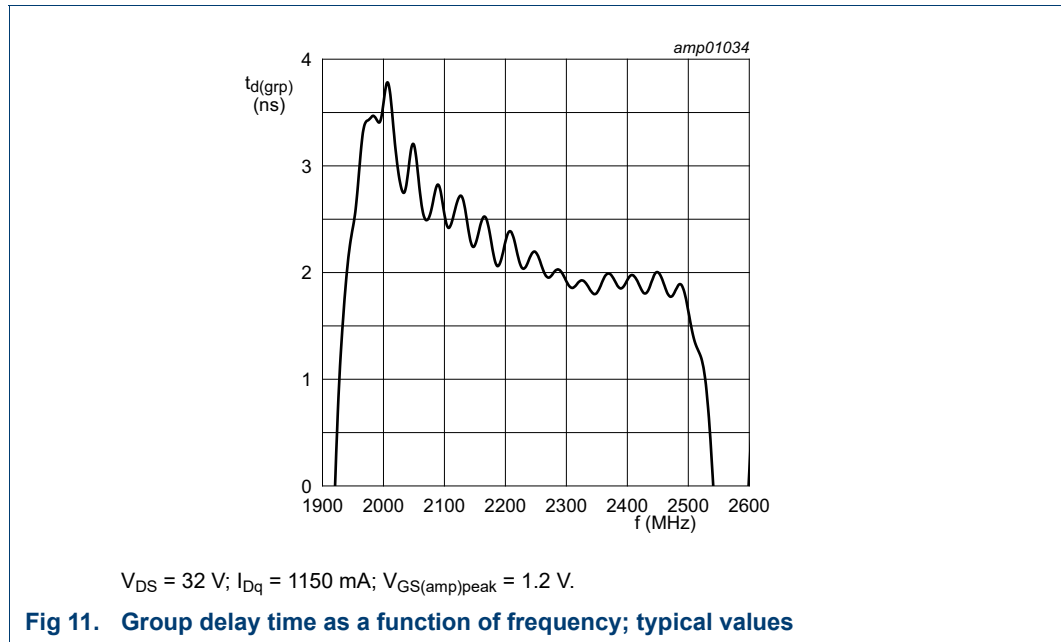

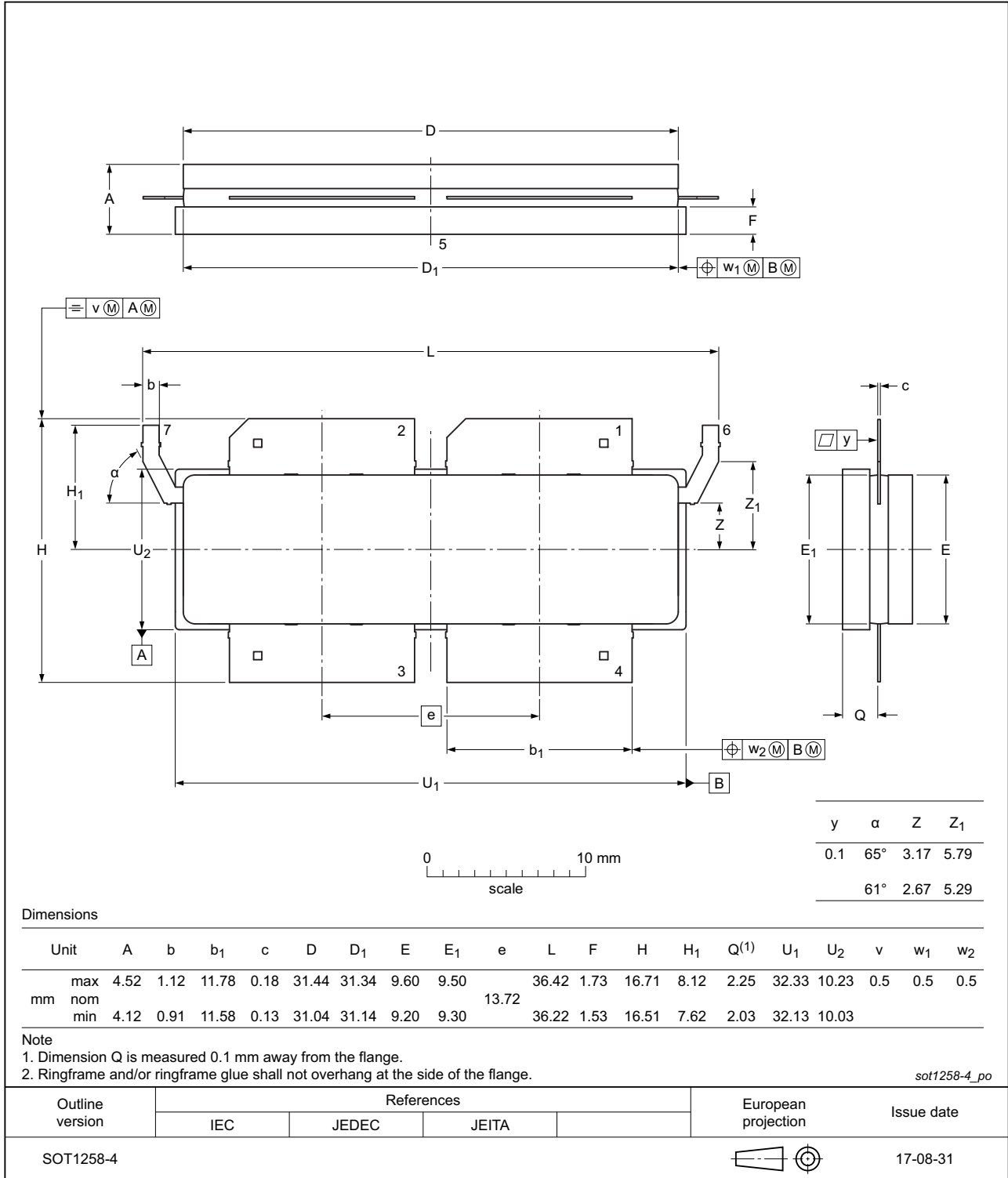


Fig 12. Package outline SOT1258-4
