This N+P Channel MOSFET uses advanced trench technology and design to provide excellent $R_{DS(on)}$ with low gate charge.

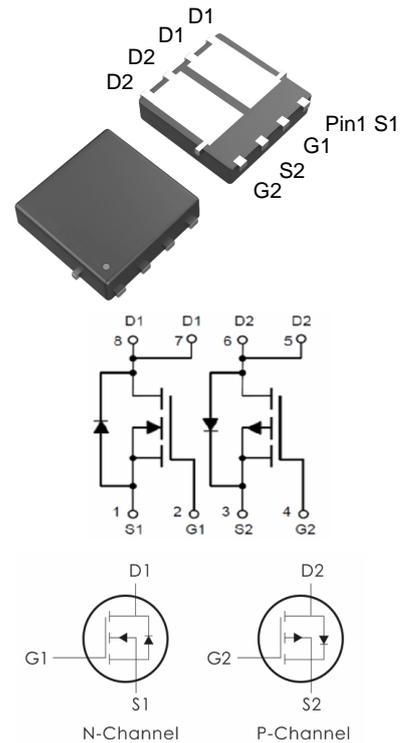
It can be used in a wide variety of applications.

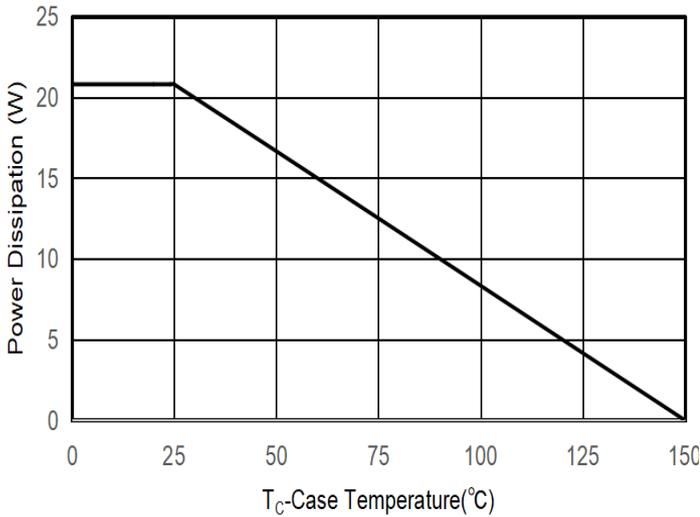


Figure 1: Power De-rating

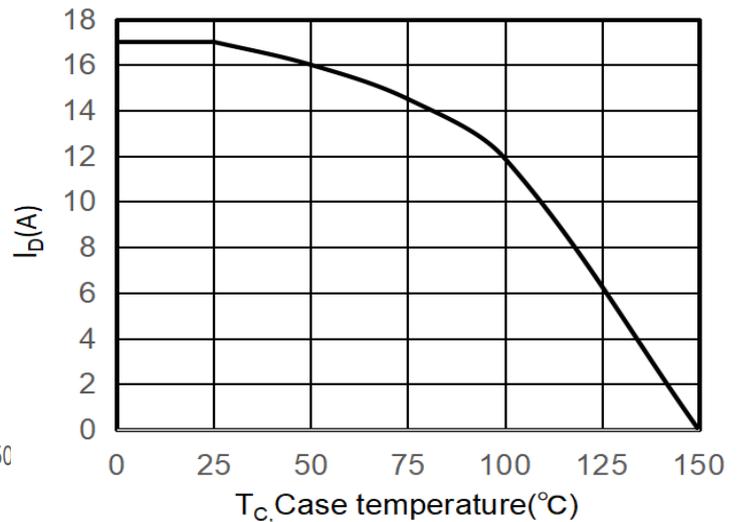


Figure 2: Current De-rating

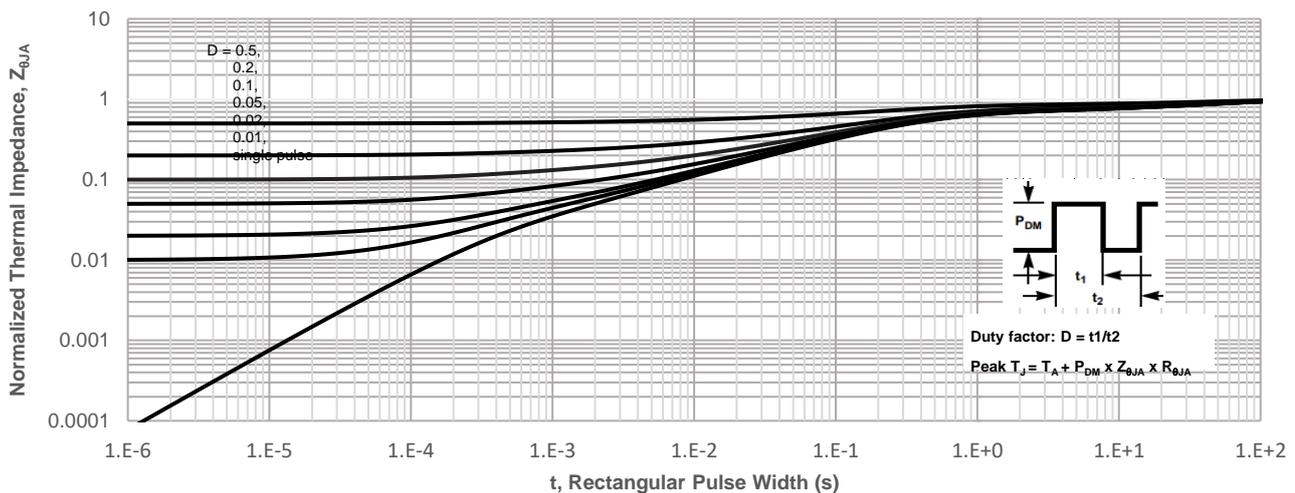


Figure 3: Normalized Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance

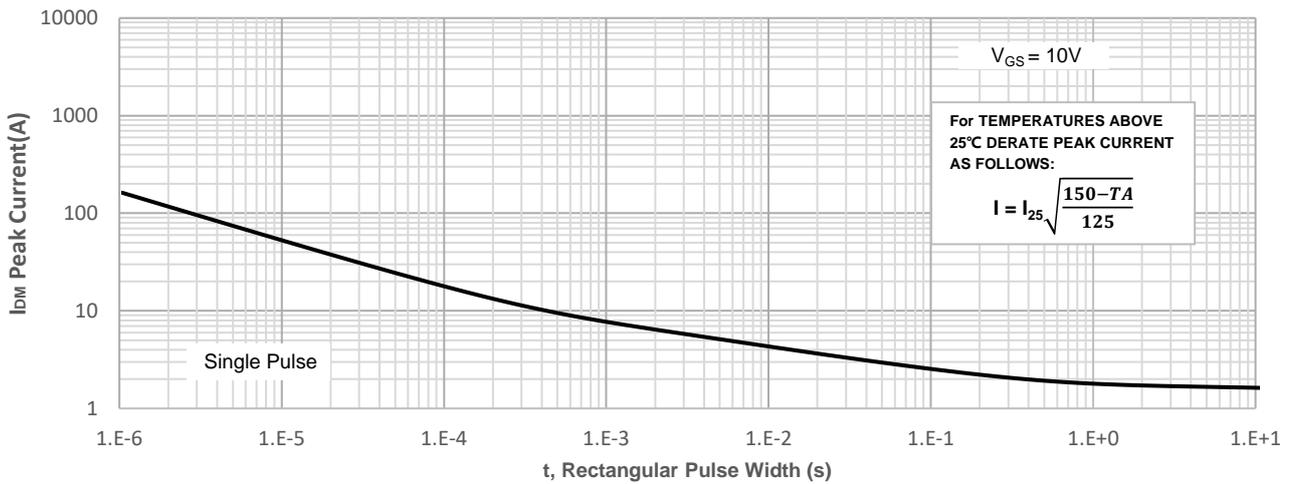


Figure 4: Peak Current Capacity

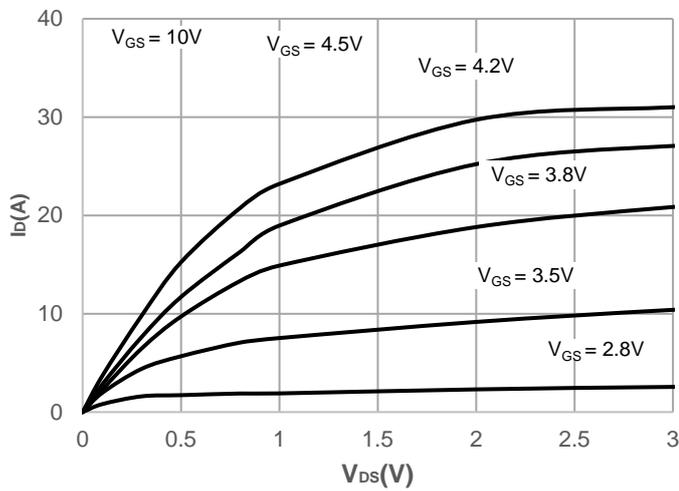


Figure 5: Output Characteristics

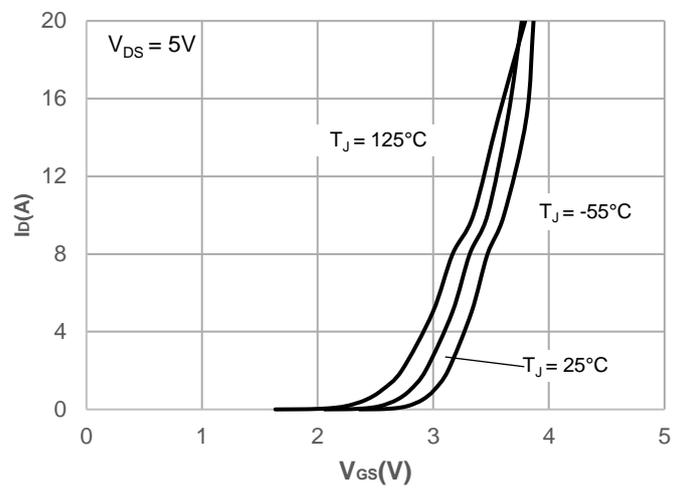


Figure 6: Typical Transfer Characteristics

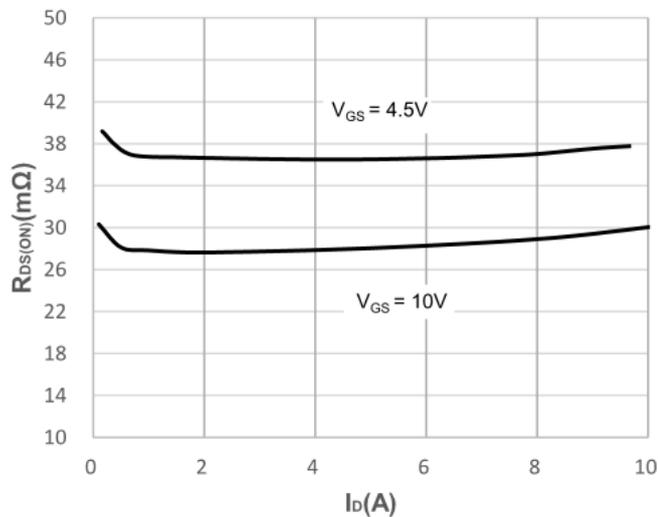


Figure 7: On-resistance vs. Drain Current

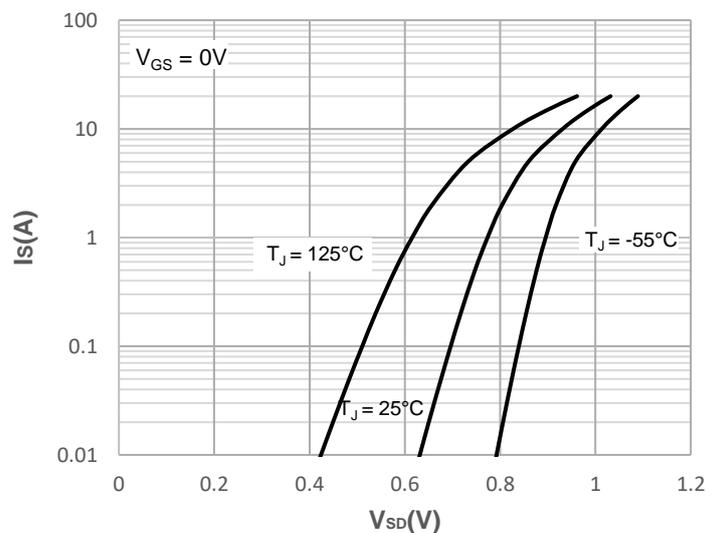


Figure 8: Body Diode Characteristics

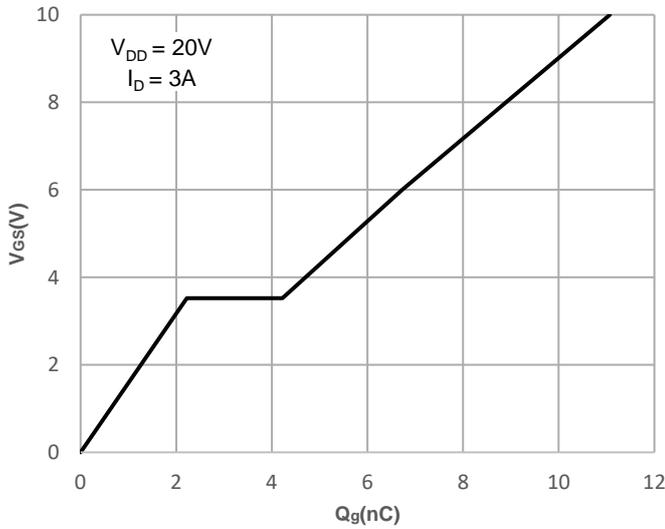


Figure 9: Gate Charge Characteristics

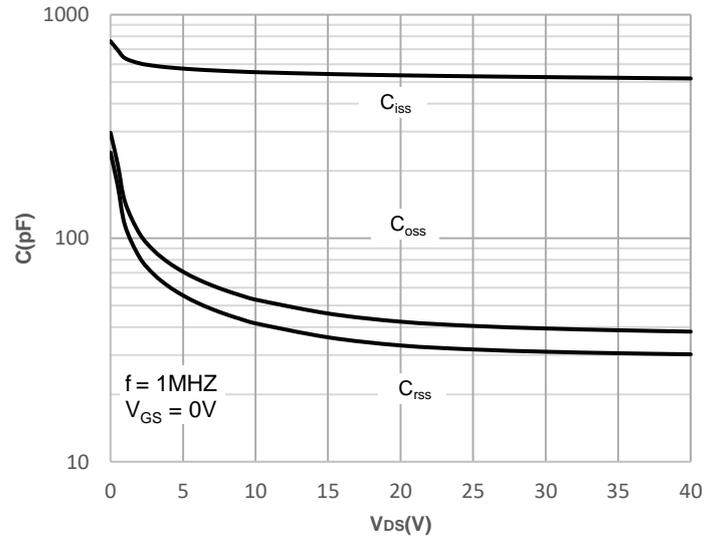


Figure 10: Capacitance Characteristics

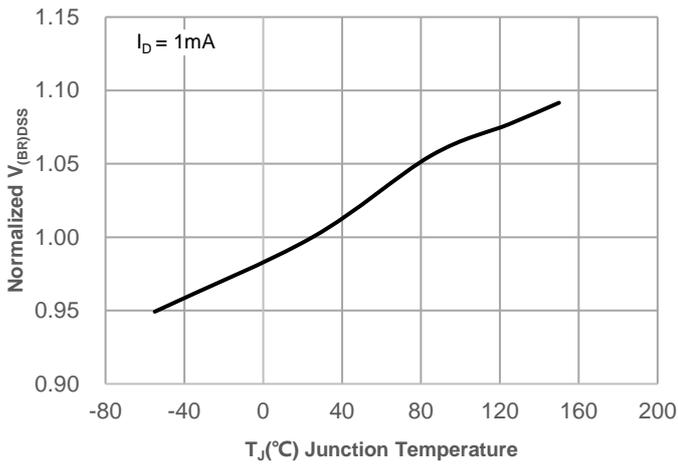


Figure 11: Normalized Breakdown voltage vs. Junction Temperature

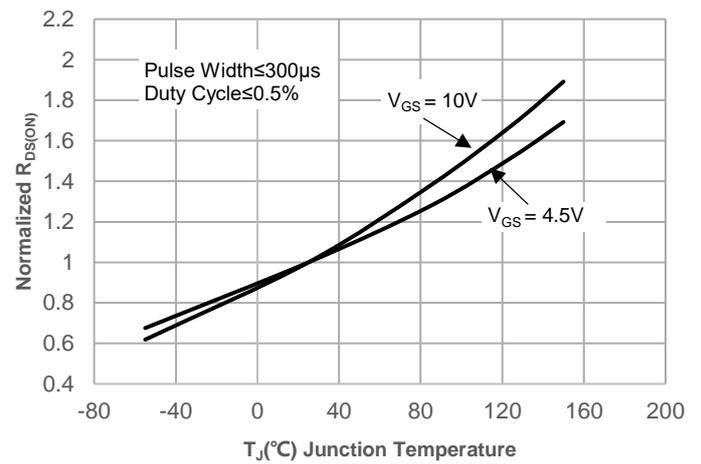


Figure 12: Normalized on Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

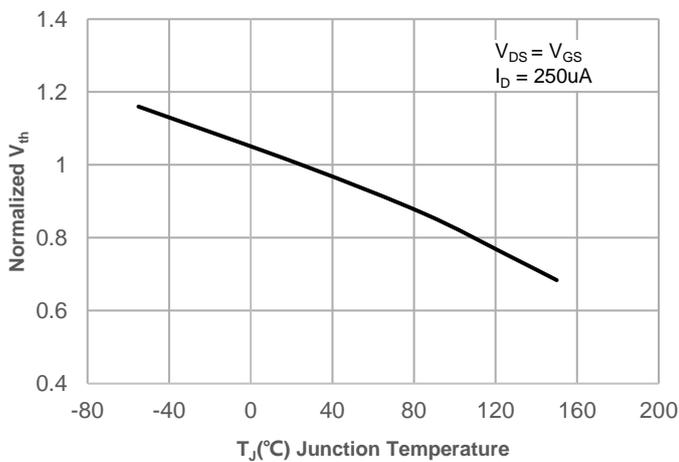


Figure 13: Normalized Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

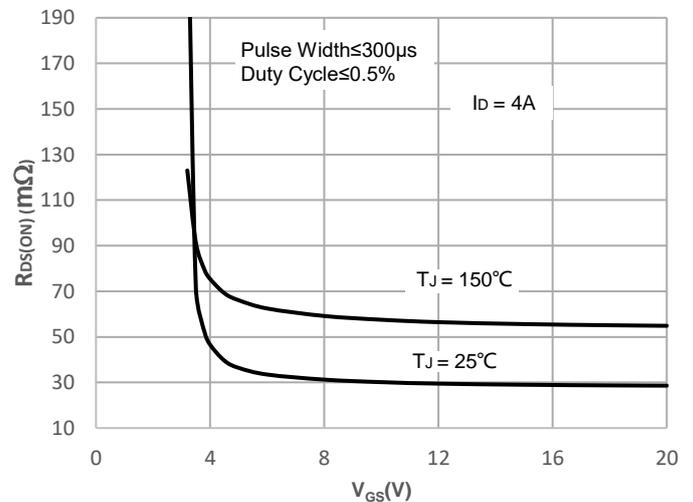


Figure 14: $R_{DS(ON)}$ vs. V_{GS}

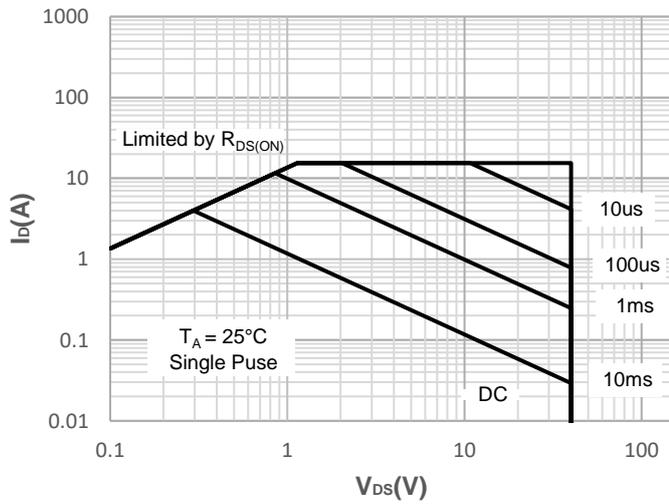


Figure 15: Maximum Safe Operating Area

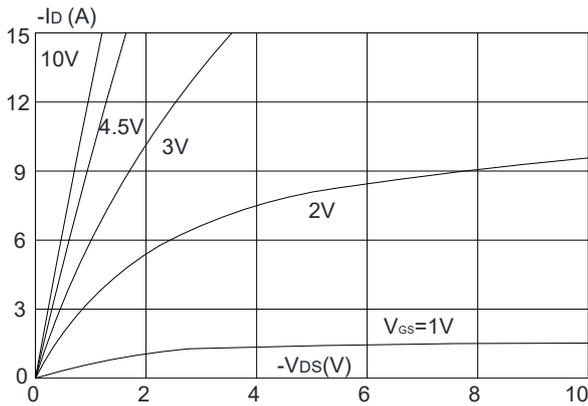


Figure 1: Output Characteristics

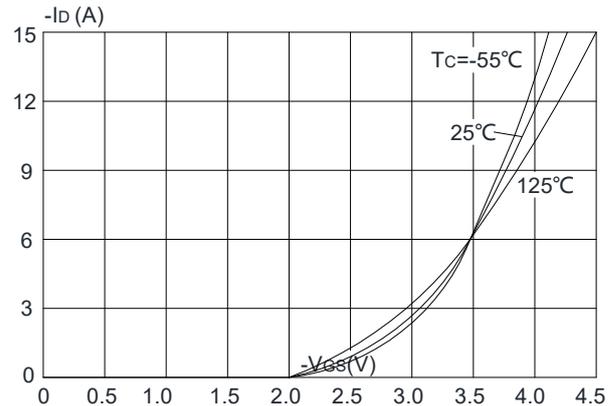


Figure 2: Typical Transfer Characteristics

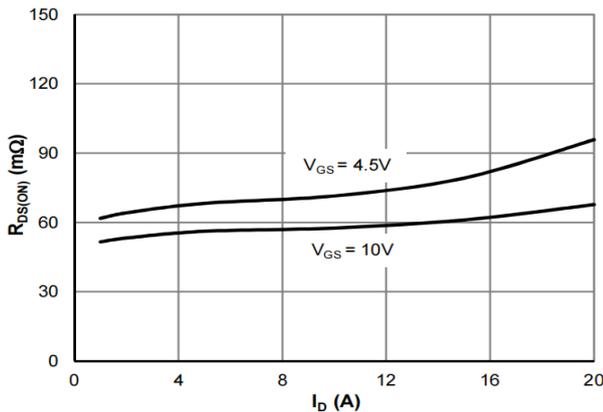


Figure 3: On-resistance vs. Drain Current

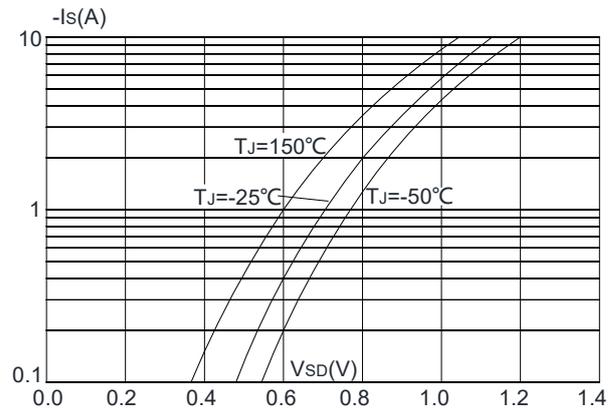


Figure 4: Body Diode Characteristics

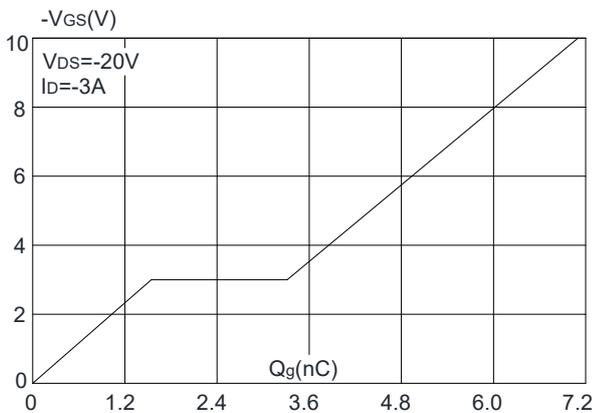


Figure 5: Gate Charge Characteristics

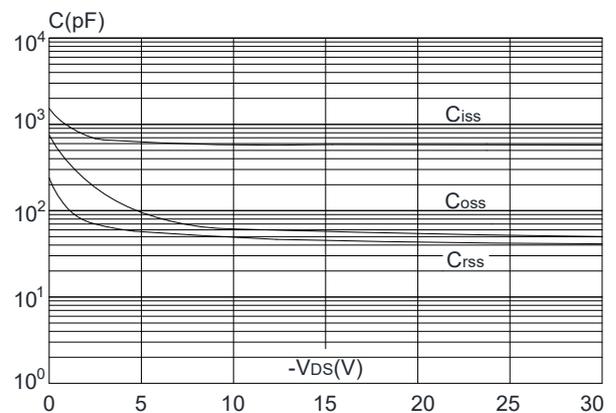


Figure 6: Capacitance Characteristics

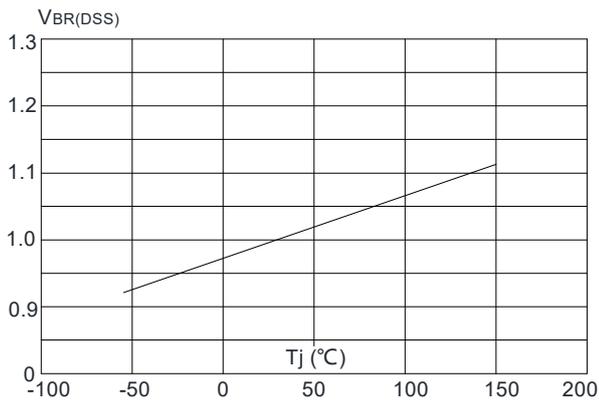


Figure 7: Normalized Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

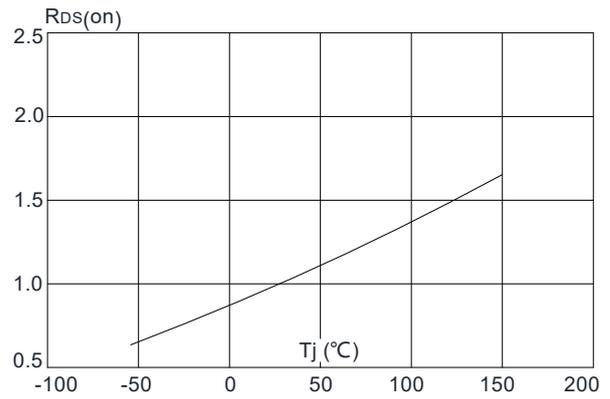


Figure 8: Normalized on Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

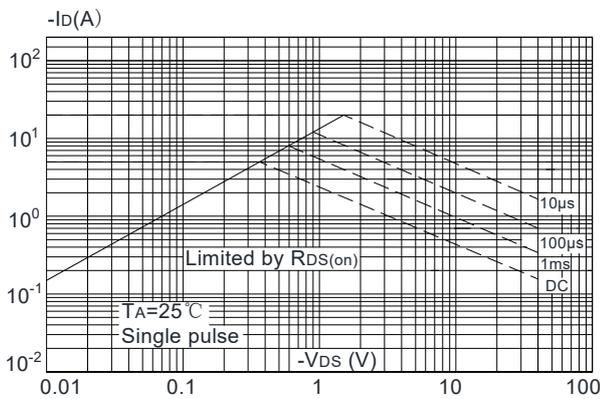


Figure 9: Maximum Safe Operating Area

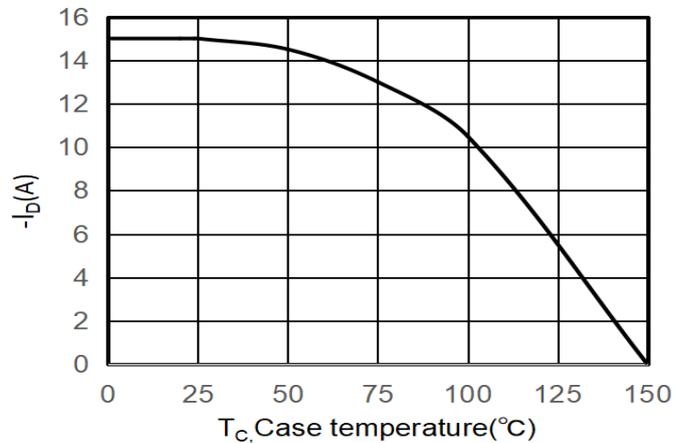


Figure 10: Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs. Ambient Temperature

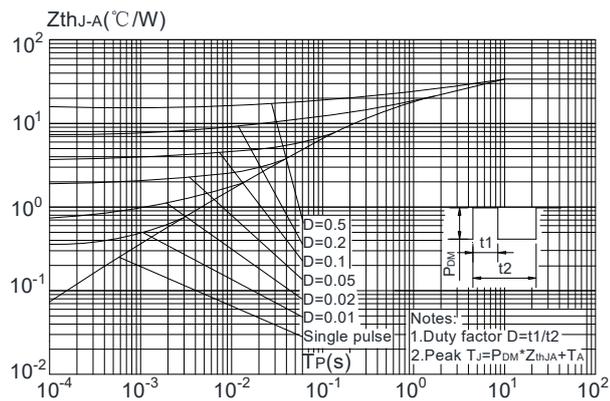
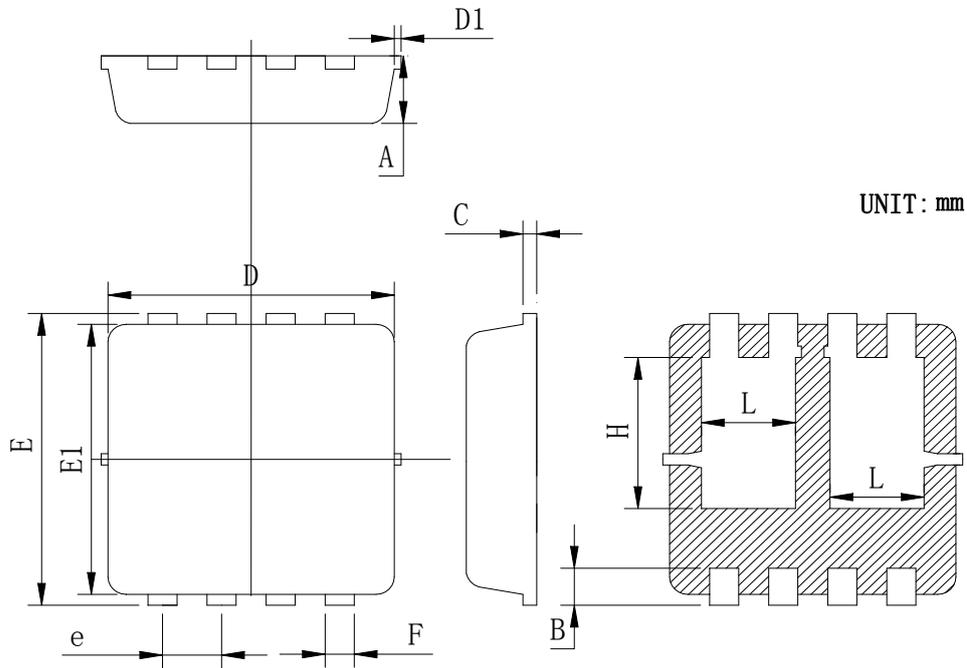


Figure.11: Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient

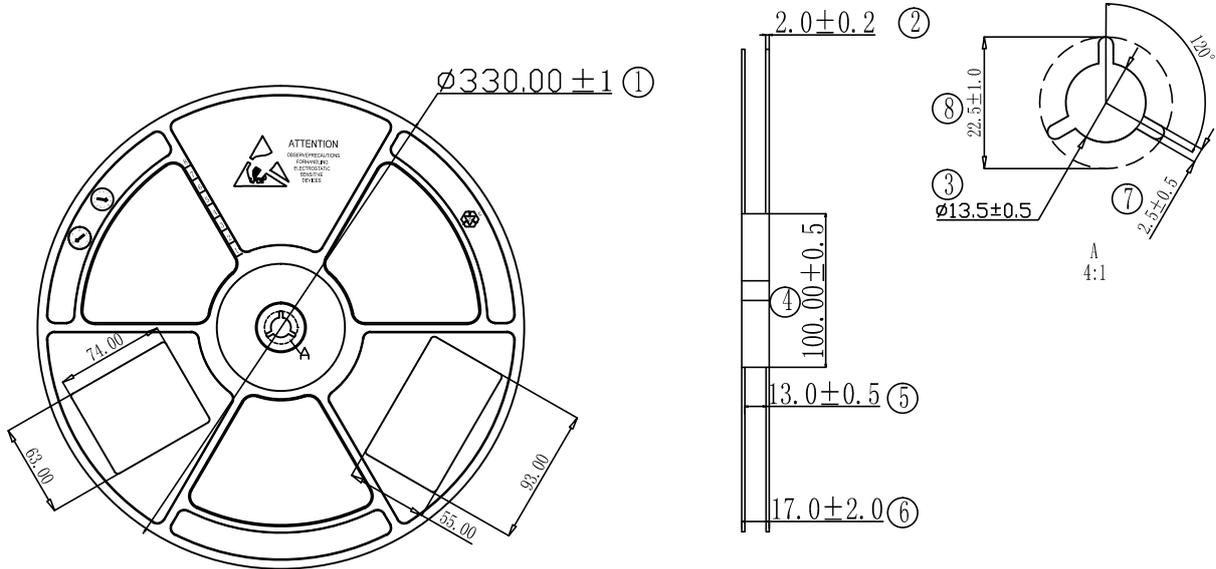

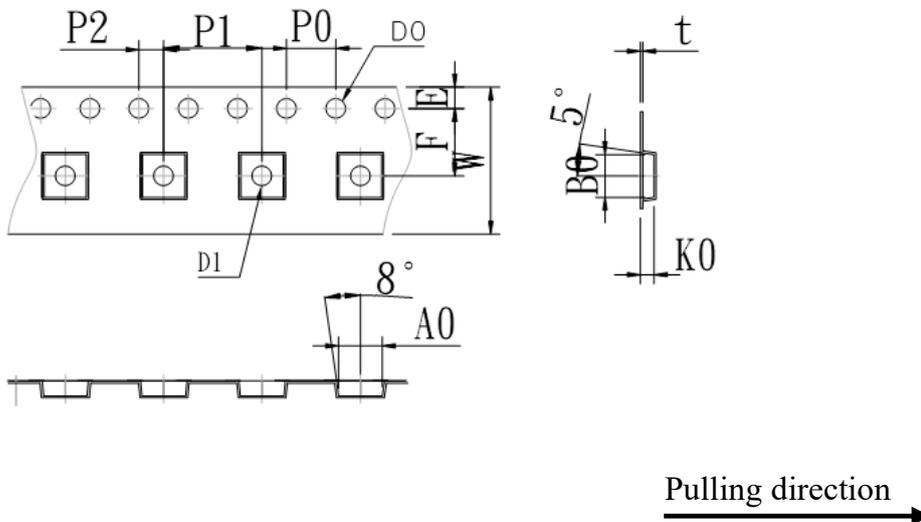

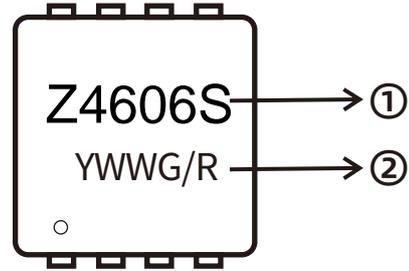
