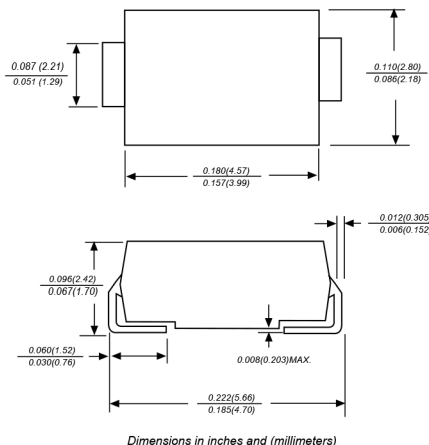

FIG. 1 – FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

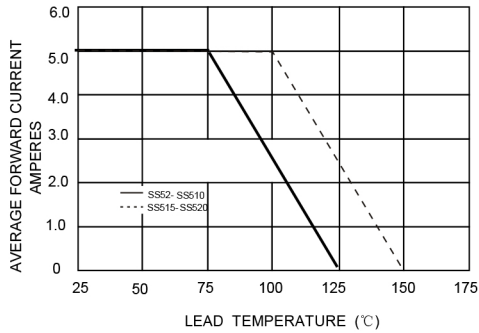


FIG. 2 – MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE SURGE CURRENT

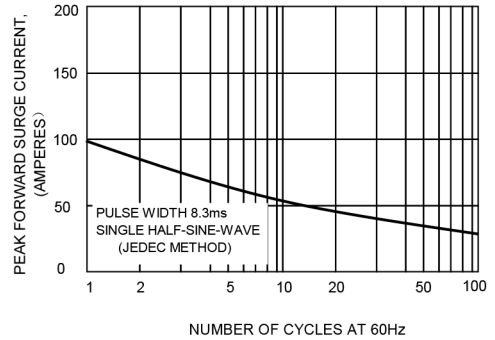


FIG. 3 – TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE

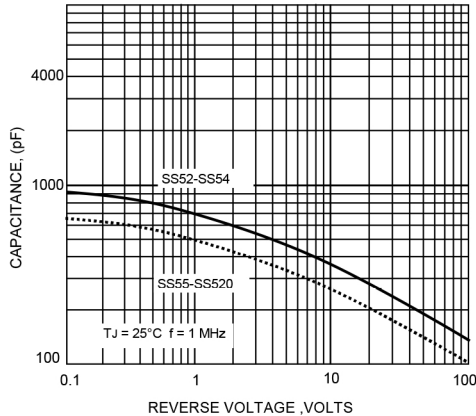


FIG. 4 – TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

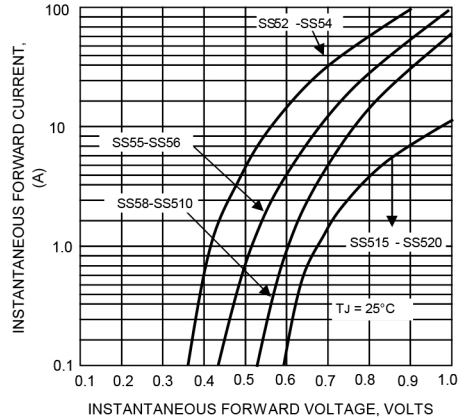


FIG. 2-TYPICAL REVER CHARACTERISTICS
